
Wet conditions can wreak havoc on your floor safety program, especially when excessive water, rain, snow or slush are being tracked into your facility. Follow these best practices for maintaining your Grippy Mats to help you keep your floors clean, dry and safe.









Plan ahead.

The best way to handle wet conditions is to create a plan that lays out the steps for managing water on your floor.

First, determine the areas you'll need to watch and how often you'll need to check them. Then, make it someone's job to do it.

Next, gather the equipment you'll need.

Finally, be vigilant about keeping your floor dry with a dry mop, wet vac and blower.

Keep it clear.

If you're in a snowy area, clearing the walkways of snow, ice and slush won't just stop slips and falls outdoors, it will keep the mess from being carried in on people's boots and shoes.

Shopping carts also track in the mess on their wheels, so keep your parking lot as clean as possible.

Make sure to stock up with ice melt to keep your walkways safe in freezing temps.

Size matters.

Coverage is key to a safe walking surface. Use longer runs or wider widths of Grippy Mat at entrances to capture water that tracks in.

Watch for traffic patterns and make sure you put down adequate walk-off in all directions - usually 10'–15' or enough for six steps.

Consider heavyweight mats for your wettest periods. It absorbs 70% more to provide extra capacity for heavy saturation.

Grab a mop.

If you're not dealing with extreme conditions, you can use a dry mop to remove moisture and keep the floor dry.

Grippy Mat's low profile lets you easily mop back and forth across the mat and back to the floor without hangups.


Blow 'em dry.

A fully saturated mat dries in less than five hours, but a good blower will speed up evaporation.

Keep 'em clean.

Regular vacuuming and deep cleaning will remove dirt and keep your Grippy Mats performing at their best.

In snowy areas where salt is tracked in, vacuum the dry residue before mopping or scrubbing.
