

PERMIT-REQUIRED CONFINED SPACES V

A confined space is an area that is large enough for an adult to enter and perform work. These areas are not intended for continuous human occupancy and have limited or restricted means of entry and exit. Some examples are tanks, silos, pits, manholes, tunnels, crawlspaces, ductwork, pipelines and equipment housings.





Go through the following steps before entering a permit-required confined space:

- 1. Complete any necessary training
- 2. Test for oxygen levels, then test for other hazardous atmospheres
- 3. Review entry procedures and other information on the permit
- **4.** Gather and/or assemble continuous air monitoring, fall protection, rescue, lighting and communication equipment that will be needed
- 5. Notify supervisor of entry
